

The References Page - APA Style 6th Edition



This guide is a brief introduction to some of the most common types of citations using APA style. This guide is a modification of the rules of citing materials using APA style, which were developed by the American Psychological Association (APA). APA In-Text Citation

Author (year) said, “Quote in quotation marks followed by page in parentheses” (p. ###).

She said that all sentences that do not explicitly mention the author, should have all three pieces of information in parentheses (Author last name, year of publication, p. ###).

Author Last Name (year) stated in a narrative, should end with just the page number (p. ###).

Core Elements for References List

Basic APA citation for the Reference List

Author Last Name, F. M., & Author Last Name, F. M. (date). Title of article or chapter. *Title of main work in italics: Subtitle of main work in italics, volume # in italics* (issue #), page-range. Place of publication: Publisher. doi:###.#####.##### or Retrieved from <http://journalURL> with no punctuation following all in Times New Roman font size 12.

Common Sources Found in the Cypress College Library

Book with 1 Author

Book with 2 Authors

Book with 3 to 6 Authors

Sanchez Vidiella, A., Fajardo Herrero, J., & Costa Duran, S. (2017). *1000 architectural details: A selection of the world's most interesting building elements*. Richmond Hill, ON: Firefly Books.

Note: If a book has more than six authors, use an ellipses (...) after the sixth name followed by the last author listed.

Chapter, Essay, or Other Work that Appears in an Anthology

Article in a Specialized Encyclopedia or Dictionary

Multitouch displays. (2016). In D. R. Franceschetti (Ed.), *Principles of computer science* (pp. 201-203). Ipswich, MA.: Salem Press.

Note: If an author's name is not given, begin your citation with the name of the article.

Overall Look Checklist

- Center the title, References, under the header.
- Use double spacing throughout.
- Begin each entry at the left margin. If an entry runs more than one line, indent the subsequent lines one-half inch from the margin as hanging.
- For titles of works, capitalize the first words in titles and subtitles, and proper nouns only.
- Alphabetize entries by the author's last name or, if no author, by the first main word in the title.
