<b>General description of Incident, Student Conduct Code/ Criminal Violation:</b>	Three (3) actives at Tailgate and the afternoon and evening of Tailgate hazed eight (8) of the associate members at an "event" at Texas Tech University in Lubbock, Texas on November 5. Student Conduct Code Violation: Hazing endangerment to person or property, Disruptive conduct, Alcohol, Intimidation
<b>Findings/Sanction</b>	Findings: It was three (3) actives of the organization that hazed eight associated members Sanction: Conduct Probation through Fall 2017 for hazing and non-hazing violations

<b>Date of Investigation Initiated, if any:</b>	December 6, 2017
<b>General description of Incident, Student Conduct Code/ Criminal Violation:</b>	Complaints raised about early morning trips, taking membership candidates to the cemetery, greetings, and Sisterhood Week events. Student Conduct Code Violation: Hazing, health, and safety of any person, and intimidation
<b>Findings/Sanction</b>	Findings: Matter was investigated by the National Headquarters. •The Chapter was found to be in violation Hazing and health safety of any person and intimidation as a result of activities but not all of the members of Tau Beta Sigma participated in the activities.  Sanctions: The organization was placed on Organizational Suspension, pending completion of action plan requirements, including revision of internal procedures, working with a National Headquarters designee, and participation in various education and training initiatives. Once completed, the organization will return to active status July 26, 2018. (Failure to comply with any of these terms will result in further disciplinary action, including the possible suspension or closure of the chapter by National.)

Hunewell);</li> <li>• Breakfast “kidnapping” on the morning of initiation;</li> <li>• “Paddling” of candidates after the gifting of paddles to big brothers; and hazing and Disruptive behavior</li> </ul>
