## 1. Single-Author Book

Author's Last Name, Author's First Initial. *Title of the Book* (Edition, if applicable).  
Publisher Name.

### Example:

Smith, J. *The Art of Leadership* (2nd ed.). Pearson Education.

## 2. Multiple-Authors Book

Author 1's Last Name, Author 1's First Initial., & Author 2's Last Name, Author 2's First Initial. *Title of the Book* (Edition, if applicable). Publisher Name.

### Example:

Brown, L. M., & Johnson, R. *Effective Teamwork Strategies*. Wiley.

## 3. Edited Book

Editor's Last Name, Editor's First Initial. (Ed.). *Title of the Book*. Publisher Name.

### Example:

Clark, P. (Ed.). *Innovation in Modern Business*. Cambridge Press.

## 4. Chapter in an Edited Book

Author's Last Name, Author's First Initial. Title of the chapter. In Editor's First Initial. Editor's Last Name (Ed.), *Title of the Book* (pp. page range). Publisher Name.

### Example:

Taylor, M. The future of AI in education. In L. Roberts (Ed.), *Technological Advances* (pp. 35-50). Cambridge Press.

## **5. Translated Book**

Author's Last Name, Author's First Initial. *Title of the Book* (Translator's Initial Last Name, Trans.). Publisher Name.

### **Example:**

Lopez, C. *The Power of Mindfulness* (J. Brown, Trans.). HarperCollins.

## **6. Book with No Author**

*Title of the Book* (Edition, if applicable). Publisher Name.

### **Example:**

*The Essentials of Project Management* (3rd ed.). McGraw-Hill.

## **7. E-Book**

Author's Last Name, Author's First Initial. *Title of the E-Book*. Publisher Name.

### **Example:**

Williams, A. *Digital Marketing for Beginners*. Pearson Education.
