




## Container Book Report

Due: Friday October 12, 2012



Step 1: Choose a chapter book in your AR level. Make sure it is one you can finish reading by October 12.

Step 2: Read the book.

Step 3: Select a book report container, examples are a paper bag, and oatmeal box, a coffee can, a shoebox, a manila envelope or anything else that might be appropriate.

Step 4: Include 5 things in your container that have a connection to the story. They should be objects or pictures. Decorate your container with the book title, pictures, words ect, that are relevant to the story.

Step 5: Create a 5-word glossary of unfamiliar words from the book. Use the graphic organizer attached. Include the word and definition.

Step 6: Write 5 questions that could be answered by reading the book that you chose. These questions should be a variety of question types. List the question type, your question, and the answer. Refer to blue sheet in data notebook for question types.

Step 7: Complete the AR test on your book and print the results.

Step 8: Present your container and objects to the class on Friday October 12.

Container- decorated, includes the title, author, pictures and words- **5 points**

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Things- has 5 things that have a connection to the book-  
**5 points**

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Vocabulary- created a 5-word glossary of unfamiliar words in the book. Includes the word and definition. - **5 points**

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Questions/Answers- wrote 5 questions of different types, along with the answers.  
**5 points**

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Presentation- prepared a short presentation sharing the container, explaining the connection of the container to the story, the relevance of the things in the container to the story, and then shared some of the books narrative elements. These include setting, characters, and plot. **5 points**
