Interdisciplinary Honors Track (12 credit hours)

- Students who complete interdisciplinary Honors Track requirements earn a transcript designation.
- Honors offers several interdisciplinary tracks for students interested in exploring a topic or a future career interest. Each interdisciplinary track is made up of a core course, directed electives, and experience-based learning. See page 2 for interdisciplinary track curriculum options.

University Honors Minor (24 credit hours)

- Students who complete 24 credit hours in the Emory Lindquist Honors Scholar track and an Honors Interdisciplinary track earn the **University Honors Minor** and a diploma designation. See page two for interdisciplinary track curriculum details.

Honors Baccalaureate (HB)

- HB students design a rigorous, personalized plan of study in two or three disciplines from at least two other colleges and complete a capstone project to earn a degree conferred by the Cohen Honors College.
- HB students also complete the Emory Lindquist Honors Scholar and Honors Interdisciplinary Track requirements.
- Students need a minimum 120 credit hours to receive the Honors Baccalaureate degree.
- Talk to your Honors advisor about this degree.
