International students are required to purchase OSU comprehensive health insurance throughout the duration of their study. In addition, it is recommended they purchase health insurance for family members accompanying them.

LIVING EXPENSES is a minimum estimate of additional student expenses including housing, utilities, food, clothing, books and supplies, local transportation, laundry and other miscellaneous personal expenses. Actual expenses may vary depending upon the type of housing chosen and personal lifestyle. Additional expenses for a spouse or child are not included in the above total and are shown below.
