## From the principal.....

### 2020 class structures

We are fast approaching the end of the term and with the year we have had, there is a lot to do in preparation for a new year. The building works are continuing to be on schedule and we are preparing for the decanting of grade areas in readiness for the start of next year. There has been some movement in enrolment due to the impact of the pandemic and we have been working to confirm our class sizes and staffing over the past few weeks.

Our class structure for 2021 will be 26 classes:

- Foundation A, B, C D
- Grade 1 A, B, C, D, E
- Grade 2 A, B, C, D
- Grade 3 A, B, C
- Grade 4 A, B, C, D
- Grade 5 A, B, C
- Grade 6 A, B, C

We are finalising grade placements and staffing this week in preparation of our **Meet the Teacher day on Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> of December**. All students will transition to their new grade and meet their 2021 teacher. Some grades will not be able to visit the physical space that they will be in due to the building works but will be told where they will need to be for next year by their new teacher.

### Final Assembly

With the current easing of restrictions, we are now able to host an outdoor event to celebrate the end of the year. We will hold our traditional last assembly on the oval on **Thursday 17<sup>th</sup> December** at 3pm with all classes attending.

We ask that only **one** parent per family to limit the numbers on the oval and so we can maintain social distancing with the exception of the grade 6 parents who can both attend if they wish. The grade 6 students will have the opportunity to perform their graduation dance for the school and say their final farewell. We will be dismissing the students at **3.30pm** from the oval for the last time for 2020, capping off an extraordinary year!

### Class formation

Due to the extended lockdown this year, we prioritised keeping the younger students in Foundation and Grade 1 together as class groupings for 2021 as they move to grade 1 and 2 because they are establishing friendships and to minimise disruption to their social groupings.

The older students in grade 2-5 have been given a chance to nominate their friendship preferences so that we can reorganise the classes for next year and social connections are considered. We ensure that all students have one of the friends on their list so that they have a friend going with them to their new class while allowing them the opportunity to expand their friendship groups. To achieve a balance in the 2021 grade 3-6 classes we have considered class numbers, behaviour, gender balance, academics and social connections to form new classes for the next year. As we say every year, it is always important to have a friend connection as well as meeting and working with different children to build resilience and confidence.

#### **Specialist programs for 2021**

For 2021 we will continue the same allotment of specialist programs. Grade 1-6 class will have one semester of Italian and one semester of STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Maths) as well as one session weekly of ART and PE. All classes will have one Performing Arts lesson per fortnight. Over the course of 2021, our students will be able to experience five specialist areas taught by teachers who will support the classroom PYP units of Inquiry through their speciality. Foundation students will be taught Italian for the whole year and their STEAM learning will be integrated into their Discovery time with their class teacher.

#### **Tutor initiative**

As promised by the state budget, all government schools have received funding for 2021 to employ tutors to support any students who have been impacted by this year's pandemic and have not made the expected growth. There will be a flyer from the DET sent to all families in Compass with more information about this program. It is limited funding for 2021 only. We are in the process of organising the employment of staff and development of a teaching program to deliver an effective program to support students who have been identified as needing this extra support. Parents will be notified next year if their child is to be a part of this program.

#### **Special thanks**

A big thank you to our Wales Street Social group, Fete committee and parent volunteers who have been working away to find new and innovative ways to navigate through a severe lockdown to still support the school and fundraise as much as possible. We managed a Zoom Trivia night, the Mango drive, the silent auction, jam sales and mask sales, a wine auction (still going) and online second hand uniform shop this year which was an amazing effort.

Our school council has also had a big year, meeting online since March and working through the building project, Nature Play, COVID 19 issues and appointment of a new principal.
