I. INTRODUCTION

Guided by its motto, “Creating Wealth and Enriching Lives,” the Philippine Mining Development Corporation (PMDC) is unwavering in its commitment for the Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) that aims to continuously assist its host and neighboring communities in their development agenda.

PMDC’s CSR commitment is fleshed out in its program collectively dubbed as H.E.R.O., which stands for Health, Education/Environment, Rural Infrastructure, and Opportunities to Earn.

For CY 2018, PMDC employed the indicator, “number of beneficiaries”, to effectively determine the breadth reached by the projects/programs and activities implemented during the year. Thus, PMDC’s CY 2018 goal for CSR is to be able to serve the six thousand (6,000) beneficiaries through its various projects and activities.

II. CSR PROGRAMS AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS

HEALTH

Medical and Dental Mission and Good Grooming Activity in Diwalwal Mineral Reservation Area (DMRA)

On October 12, 16 , 17 & 23, 2018, Philippine Mining Development Corporation (PMDC) organized a Medical and Dental Mission and Good Grooming Activity in the four (4) barangays in DMRA, namely: Mt. Diwata, Upper Ulip, Naboc and Tubo-Tubo in Monkayo, Compostela Valley Province. The activity was conducted in partnership with the Provincial and Local Governments of Monkayo and Compostela Valley Province and 25th IB, 10th ID Philippine Army. Services availed by the community were: (1) general consultation, (2) tooth extraction (3) hair cut, and (4) provision of medicines and vitamins. There were 1,645 individuals who participated in the activity.

Food Assistance to the Health Workers and Personnel of the Philippine National Police in Barangay Mt. Diwata and 25th IB, 10th ID Philippine Army and CAFGU in Barangay Upper Ulip

PMDC provides annually food supplies to the 29 health workers and 11 personnel of Philippine National Police of Barangay Mt. Diwata and 95 personnel of 25th IB, 10th ID Philippine Army and CAFGU in Depot Barangay Upper Ulip, Monkayo, Compostela Valley Province. The reason for the support is to ensure that these partners of PMDC are uninterrupted in their duties and that they are able to function effectively in serving the residents in the DMRA.

Distribution of Medicines to the PMDC's Host mining communities in the Province of Dinagat Islands

For several years, PMDC has been providing medical support to augment the basic health needs of its mining communities, which may be in the form of medical assistance or supplemental allowance for health staff working in wide-ranging areas.

Having health as one of the priority areas that PMDC supports under its CSR program, the company provided assistance to Rural Health Centers of Panamaon and Esperanza based on the following reasons: (1) Barangays Panamaon and Esperanza are remote communities that are approximately 108.8 kilometers away from the city proper of Loreto with a combined population of around 2,589 individuals; and (2) To support the barangay health workers (nurse or midwife) in the performance of their duties in ensuring accessibility to the health services by the community.

EDUCATION

Distribution of School Supplies to the Elementary Schools in DMRA

PMDC distributed school supplies to the elementary pupils in the four barangays in DMRA. The distribution of supplies covered the kinder and all grade levels in the elementary school. The initiative was aimed at increasing access of the pupils to education due to the availability of school supplies. The school supplies were pad paper, notebook, eraser, crayon, pencil/ball pen, scissors, and paste.

Distribution of Raincoats to Two Elementary Schools in Loreto, Dinagat Islands

PMDC distributed also raincoats to two elementary schools in Loreto, Dinagat Islands. This project is a continuing initiative of the company that aims to support the pupils access the basic education, particularly during bad weather condition. A total of 430 students were benefited by the initiative. Twenty teachers received raincoats also to protect them from heavy rain during school days. Aside from students there were 20 teachers who received raincoats.

ENVIRONMENT

Advocacy Campaign on Responsible Mining and Sustainable Development in the Four Barangays in DMRA

The advocacy campaign on responsible mining and sustainable development was carried out to execute the additional task of PMDC, which is to protect and preserve the environment within the DMRA. This mandate is consistent with the thrust of the Duterte Administration, which is to protect and to preserve the environment against the illegal effects of mining. The recently conducted advocacy campaign was the second campaign by PMDC under the leadership of Atty. Alberto Sipaco, Jr.. The first one was held on July 10-15, 2017 covering the barangays of Naboc, Tubo-Tubo, Upper Ulip, and Mt. Diwata. Moreover, these advocacy campaigns were triggered by the unresponsiveness of the operators/owners of a small-scale ball mill and carbon-in-pulp processing plants in Barangay Mt. Diwata.

There were 825 attendees in the campaign composed of 660 community members and 165 PMDC, resource persons, and representatives of the Armed Forces of the Philippines.

OPPORTUNITIES TO EARN

Community Diagnosis

To ensure that the community is capable of implementing and managing livelihood or opportunities to earn projects in DMRA, PMDC Community Relations Team initially conducted an organizational diagnosis in Barangays Upper Ulip, Naboc, and Tubo-Tubo in Monkayo, Compostela Valley Province last November 28, December 3, and December 19, 2018, respectively. The groups involved were Senior Citizens Association and Persons with Disability, and Lower Naboc Irrigators Association. The organizational diagnosis was intended to determine the level of maturity of an organization so that capability building interventions be designed to enhance the capacity of an organization to implement livelihood or opportunities to earn projects.

Skills Profiling

In preparation for the upcoming mining exploration and operation activities in DMRA wherein PMDC will employ locals as mandated by the Philippine Mining Act of 1995, PMDC had determined first the availability of skills in the area. This was done through a skills profiling of 477 individuals who came from Barangays Diwata, Upper Ulip, Tubo-Tubo and Naboc. The results of the skills profiling will be used in determining what skills training needs are to be conducted with the community so they will qualify to the employment requirements of the company.

Work Order Employees for the Mebatas Relocation Site

As of December 2018, PMDC employed a total of 68 persons as its work order employees in the construction of the Mebatas Projects such as water system and tailings launder.

Mass Action/Community Consultation

PMDC conducted a community consultation with the tribal communities of Barangays Upper Ulip, Naboc and Tubo-Tubo of which it engaged a total of 22 community members to provide services such as cooking and hauling of participants to the venue. The purpose of the mass action was to generate support from the community for the upcoming mining exploration activities in DMRA.
