Presentation: research findings on social cohesion (BBC MA)	
Discussions	BBC MA has conducted a study to understanding the relationship (social cohesion) between the Rohingya and Host Communities. On behalf of BBC MA, Fuad Ur Rabbi has presented the study findings. Details are given in the presentation (attached). Following the presentation, audience asked question about the unfavorable perception of polygamy and relation of children between the communities. In response Mr. Fuad stated that polygamy issue has mostly raised by host community responders who claimed Rohingya people has a tendency of polygamy which has effect on social structure, and this study was not exploring the relation of children but it may be covered in future study.

JRP 2021- Updates and next steps	
Discussions	<p>Following the last discussion, CwC secretariate has sought for agency interest to participate in CwC JRP 2021 exercise. According to decision on last meeting, an orientation on overall JRP process and template has been conducted on 14 October. Beforehand, SAG meeting has also been taken place to discuss on CwC WG Strategic Objective, indicators, PIN, Target, criteria for reviewing the project, and formation of peer review team (PRT). In this meeting, CwC WG Coordinator has presented the key information of process which includes timeframe, strategic objectives, PIN and target for both refugee and host community, list of agencies participate in JRP process, criteria for project review, and composition of peer review team.</p> <p>In discussion, CPJ has expressed their interest to participate in JRP 2021 exercise.</p>
Action point	<ul style="list-style-type: none">✓ CwC WG member has agreed with the CwC proposed strategic objective and project review criteria.✓ For JRP target, CwC WG will consider above 5 years old people in both refugee and host community.✓ For host community population target, people live in 5 kilometres radius from camp boundary will be considered as target.✓ Peer review team (PRT) will include CwC WG Coordinator as chair, 1 ISCG representative, 2 UN – Daniel (IOM) and Alamgir (Unicef), 1 INGO - Mahmud (ACF), 1 NGO - BRAC (will ask for representative name), 1 Non JRP - Sazzad (RCRC)✓ CwC Coordinator will respond to CPJ appeal for participation in JRP 2021 soon.✓ JRP Narrative documents will be shared with members before submitting to ISCG
