- Community service hours may not be hours that benefitted the student financially or materially (*e.g., a student cannot receive free tuition to a church summer camp in exchange for volunteer hours*), and cannot be service to family members, defined as parents, grandparents, siblings, aunts, uncles, cousins, nieces, nephews, or spouses, including all step relations.
- The agencies where the community service hours were earned must provide documentation on agency letterhead of the number of hours and dates of service completed and submit with verification of community service for home education students.
- This documentation must be submitted to the Home Education contact at the student's local school district where he/she is registered as a home-educated student. Districts must keep a copy of the documents in the student's permanent file.
- Community service hours for homeschoolers may be served with a wide variety of public service organizations. Examples of acceptable agencies would be churches/synagogues/mosques, libraries, nursing homes, animal shelters, food banks, homeless shelters, etc.
