Economic Development Director Beadles began the meeting by reading the purpose of the commission: *The purpose of the Chillicothe Area Marketing and Tourism Commission is to develop a comprehensive program designed to market the Chillicothe area and promote the growth of tourism within or near the city and submit the program to the city council for recommendation and approval. All programs shall be formulated and maintained by the use of funds received through the city's hotel/motel tax.*

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**Additional Subcommittee-Arts & Entertainment**

Director Beadles reported the Mayor Hughes recommendation of an additional subcommittee of Arts & Entertainment and welcomed Denise Beattie to the Commission. Denise shared this committee started with the desire to find an additional stage for the Chillicothe Players to practice. She sees this committee as promoting cultural arts and events including story telling in the park, drum circles, small local bands, talent shows and youth theatre.

**Old Business:**

Organizations update and tourism plans

**PAVCB**– Josh was absent and Director Beadles reported on his behalf the new guides would be coming out by the end of the month.

**Chamber** (Coupon Program, Tourism Guide, Carnival, Trivia Night)-Sarah Sights was absent. No update.

**Historical Society** – Diane Colwell attended in place of Patty. She inquired about the Train Ride in which Director Beadles reported communicating with Iowa Interstate that Chillicothe would like to partner with Henry when the Train Ride came. Diane reported the need for increased signage for downtown and she reported the Zorro mural was installed at City Hall on May 26<sup>th</sup>. Diane reported two ideas: 1. Folded map to promote the river which would include River Beach Drive Chillicothe Park District, Chillicothe Observation Tower all the way to Coal Hollow. 2. A picnic menu would include the local restaurants hours and a picnic option available.

**City of Chillicothe** (Street & Parking Lot Improvements) – Director Beadles reported an advertising options of the Sunbeam newsletter for the Lake Wildwood Association. The newsletter is sent to 1,300 members as well as an additional 300-400 prints for pick up. Director Beadles reported the Parking Lot improvements and street improvements would soon begin. She reported Park Improvements of installation of park equipment at Sycamore trails, Gollnitz and Cutright Park installation of June 14<sup>th</sup>. She reminded the commission the telescopes for the observation tower were pending a late June delivery.

**Chillicothe Park District** – Kevin reported a busy weekend with the Brad Wallen Tournament. Mossville, Rome and CEC fields were busy Wednesday through Sunday. There were 350 teams. The Pool was busy with about 2,500 people in 3 days. He said carry out items to supply the vending/snack are were hard to come by and he was seeking Pay Days, Skittles and Snickers. The busy pool days made money for the capital improvements. They would be closed Monday. During the Summer the Park District employees 50 people 16-20 years old. He also reported the MS Tri-Athalon was coming up, A Craft Fair in the Fall in conjunction with Bridge to Bridge River Drive. Outdoor activity has increased and the Tyke Hyke at Coal Hollow has been successful. With the milling of 29, the CPD working with the Township will be using 90 trucks worth of milling to add additional handicap trail at Coal Hollow. The Township will store the milling until CPD can utilize. Kevin reported the dog park fencing that was taken out in the spring by an auto accident has been selected. CPD is working with the Library on a story walk. This program has 10-15 pages of a book throughout a walking path.

**Three Sisters Park** – Nancie was absent, no report

**Blue Ridge Farm** – Jim reported Picket Fence project plans to close in July. The foundation of the staff is staying and they will provide jobs to people with disabilities as well as housing. He reports 2 and ¾ of the pieces of the project puzzle have been acquired. The family friendly concert series will start August 13 is a kick off at Pour Brothers in Peoria Heights. The first concert at Blue Ridge Community Farm will be August 29<sup>th</sup> and other concerts September 19<sup>th</sup>, September 26<sup>th</sup>, October 3<sup>rd</sup>. These are on Sunday from 2-5pm and are free (donation/free will offering). Attendees are encouraged to bring their own snacks, lawn chairs and blankets. There are three bands for each

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date. They are looking to place 400-500 people on the hillside safely distanced. Ticket registrations will be announced online. Jim reported they would be out of town and not able to do the Petting Zoo for Chillicothe Days.

**IVC** – Nick reported school wrapped up and graduation was completed. Sports were winding down. They expect events to be a normal schedule next year.

**Pearce** – Director Beadles reported Pearce’s largest fundraiser, Annual Run for the Health of It, is scheduled for July 10<sup>th</sup>.
