



**Public Notice
Pedestrian Safety Action Plan Project**

The purpose of this notification is to inform you of the upcoming local Pedestrian Safety Action Plan (PSAP) project. This project is a part of the New York State Department of Transportation initiative to improve pedestrian safety across New York State. The City of Ithaca has received a grant through this program to provide safety improvements at local intersections.

Project Description

Pedestrian enhancements and upgrades will be performed at 10 local signalized intersections and 2 local unsignalized intersections. A project map is provided with this notification. The intersections receiving treatment are as follows:

Install Accessible Push Buttons

- Buffalo Street at Cayuga Street
- Buffalo Street at Tioga Street
- Buffalo Street at Aurora Street
- State Street at Corn Street
- State Street at Plain Street
- State Street at Albany Street
- State Street at Geneva Street

Signal Replacement With Pedestrian Upgrades

- Cayuga Street at Tompkins Street
- Cayuga Street at Lincoln Street
- State Street at Stewart Avenue

Pedestrian Refuge Island

- State Street at Eddy Street

Midblock Crossing with a Curb Extension

- 638 Stewart Avenue

Upgrades to these signalized intersections include:

- new pedestrian signals (including accessible push buttons)
- new pedestrian crossings
- enhanced crosswalk striping
- installation of a refuge island
- installing/replacing curb ramps

(Harrison Street at Crouse Ave in Syracuse, NY)

The majority of the work will be outside of the roadway behind the curb, but within the highway boundary. There should be minimal impacts to motorists, however there will be daily lane/shoulder closures with the possibility of a flag person.


Project Schedule
