



Third Party Independent Contract Worker

TCCSS provides specialized supports and services for individuals, families and service providers that contribute to the social inclusion and quality of life of persons with developmental disabilities and/or Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD).

TCCSS often receives requests from the families we support for potential contract workers. These families independently contract with workers to support their son or daughter.

The employment relationship would be between the family/caregiver and the independent contract worker, there is no connection with TCCSS. Families have specific requirements based on the needs of their son or daughter. Some requirements can include: knowledge of developmental disabilities, evening and weekend hours, attending community events, being a non-smoker and being able to drive their son or daughter within the community.

If you have an interest in being considered for an independent contract with a family and would like TCCSS to share your resume with interested families, please forward a resume and covering letter to the attention of the **HR Manager**, at hr@tccss.org quoting **Independent Contract Worker position**. There is no end date for submissions as there is an on-going need for independent contractors. There is no affiliation or implied employment relationship with TCCSS in any form or capacity.

If you are interested in expanding your experience level and your opportunities for employment, please consider registering with the Ontario Respite Service and become part of the CHAP (Community Helpers for Active Participation) program.

The CHAP program (Community Helpers for Active Participation) aims to recruit a large base of workers interested in supporting persons with a disability to provide meaningful respite opportunities through community based options. Families are able to connect with workers to fulfill Special Services At Home contracts and agencies are able to access workers to enable individuals to participate in community based respite opportunities.
