SITE IMPROVEMENT SUBMITTAL CHECKLIST

This checklist is to be used to permit work on *private property* that does not include a structure. This may be to prepare a site for construction prior to a construction permit being issued, or for modifications to a site where a structure exists but no work to the building is being proposed such as parking lot changes, drainage system changes, etc.

In the case where the application is being made to prepare for construction, a construction permit must be applied for.

Any work shown in the public right-of-way shall be referenced to an infrastructure or ROW permit and shall be shaded to clearly indicate that scope of work is not included in current application. Ensure no "build notes" are included for those items shaded.

Check each box to verify requirements are met.

Site Plan

- ☐ Legible and drawn to scale (such as 1"=20')
- ☐ Include North arrow
- ☐ Include property line locations and existing easements with dimensions
- ☐ Include the location of all utilities (water, power, sewer, gas, vaults, fire line, drainage systems, catch basins, drywells and retention ponds). Indicate if new, existing or proposed modifications.
- ☐ Show existing and proposed finished grade based on spot elevations and two foot contours over entire site and extending five feet onto surrounding properties
- ☐ Show adjacent street names
- ☐ Show perimeter outline of existing and proposed structures with distances to all property lines and between structures. Setbacks shall be identified with written dimensions as well as to scale.
- ☐ Indicate height of all structures inclusive of tree locations and trunk diameter



Accommodation Information for People with Disabilities

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- ☐ Show building and garage entrances as well as driveway and access location from street
- ☐ Indicate building surface coverage calculations (square footage of lot, footprint and percentage of lot coverage)
- ☐ If septic system, show drain field location
- ☐ Show site drainage using an arrow to indicate direction of flow. Also indicate square footage of impervious surfaces which will include asphalt, concrete, roofing, etc.
- ☐ Parking lot layout with required spaces, including accessible and van accessible spaces
- ☐ Indicate all projections that exceed 24" from exterior walls, including overhangs, awnings, etc.
- ☐ Location of all easements (utility, driveway, etc.)
- ☐ Indicate any water ways and wet lands areas on property
- ☐ All items in the engineering packet must be transferred to the plans
- ☐ Phased construction- Pre-submittal meeting required, Phased Approval Agreement must be complete and submitted before phased processing can begin **
- ☐ Geotechnical report required for all projects
 - ☐ Civil drawings- all sheets to include parking, fire service lines, water lines, etc.

Drainage

Effective February 2015, drainage reports are required to be submitted with ALL commercial projects with the exception of interior only renovations. Drainage reports shall be in compliance with Title 16 of the Bend Code.

Special Inspections

Any commercial project requiring special inspections by the design professional and/or by State Code, is required to submit a complete Special Inspection and Testing Agreement before permit Issuance.

Demolition

(Separate Demolition Application must be filled out)

Any commercial project requiring demolition is required to submit an inspection by a certified inspection company stating that no asbestos was determined to be on site, or stating that asbestos has been removed properly.

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Special Circumstances – Waste Water

The following businesses may require Waste Water Review:

- Auto Body Repair and Paint Shops
- Auto Repair (Mechanical) Engine and Transmission
- Auto Wash
- Breweries
- Blue Printing/Photocopying
- Chemical Manufacturing
- Electroplating/Metal Finishing
- Laundries
- Leather Tanning
- Machine/Sheet Metal Shops
- Millwork
- Pharmaceutical Manufacturing
- Photo Processing
- Plastic/Synthetic Manufacturing
- Print Shops
- Service Stations

The following businesses may also require a Water/Oil Separator:

- Auto Body Repair and Paint Shops
- Auto Repair (Mechanical) Engine and Transmission
- Auto Wash
- Service Stations

Special Circumstances – Potable Water

All commercial water services must have a backflow prevention assembly installed for premise isolation and initial or annual testing must be current and on file with the Public Works Department. Existing facilities which do not have a backflow prevention assembly installed, do not have the proper



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assembly type installed, or do not have a current testing on file will be required to resolve prior to final inspections of any permitted renovations as part of the permit approval conditions. Please see below for a list of uses which require specific assembly installations.

The following businesses require isolation by an approved air gap or reduced pressure principle type assembly:

- Beverage Bottling Plants
- Auto Wash
- Chemical Manufacturing
- Commercial Laundries and Dry Cleaners
- Film Processing Plants
- Food Processing Plants
- Laboratories
- Metal Plating Industries
- Mortuaries
- Petroleum Processing or Storage Plants
- Wastewater Lift and Pumping Stations and Treatment Plants
- Medical Facilities including but not limited to: Hospitals, Medical Clinics, Nursing Homes, Veterinary Clinics, Dental Clinics and Blood Plasma Centers

Premises which have the following conditions require isolation by an approved air gap or reduced pressure principle type assembly:

- Both reclaimed and potable water are used
- Irrigation systems which use chemical additions directly into water system
- Pressured piping is used to convey liquids other than potable water and the piping is installed in proximity to potable water supply
- An auxiliary water supply is connected to potable water supply
- Water is being treated by the addition of chemical or other additives

Subcontractor Applications

- ☐ All mechanical, plumbing and electrical permits will require an application be completed by the sub-contractors before the total permit cost can be calculated and before the permit can be issued.
