





Docent Corner

Silver Russian Candlesticks

The sterling silver candlesticks found on the steps of the main altar of the Mission are a part of a set of four. These candlesticks were made for the Russian Orthodox Cathedral of the Annunciation in the Kremlin of Moscow which was built in 1489. (See photo)

The candlesticks were made by "Atelier Mocba" which made many of the metal vessels and furnishings for the churches of the Kremlin Complex. They date from just after 1800 and are primarily sterling silver with some portions of a stronger metal used for stabilization that has been silver plated. They stand almost 4 feet high. They were among the vast loot that was commandeered from the cathedrals and churches of Russia by Josef Stalin and placed in a commissary store where diplomats and the privileged of the Communist Party could purchase decorative art treasures. In the early 1930's, one of the first women to circumnavigate the world was received by Stalin as a distinguished visitor and heroine. She was allowed to choose what she liked from one of these commissary stores and she picked these 4 cathedral candlesticks which were officially presented to her.

The woman later resided in Los Angeles where these objects were displayed in her home. They were electrified and converted into floor lamps.

Local benefactor H. Lewis Scott showed photos of them to Mission curator Harry Downie who desired them for the sanctuary of the Mission Church and he arranged for their delivery to Carmel having been purchased by him in 1979. They did not include the modern spring-tube candles that they now hold. Two of the candlesticks have smaller votive candle holders.

Two candles are usually displayed during Ordinary time of the liturgical year and the full set of 4 is used during the more solemn feasts of the year such as Christmas or Easter. During lent, all of the silver artifacts are removed from the altar and sanctuary.



LITURGY VAULT / STEWARDSHIP

LITURGY VAULT

"The liturgy is celebrated for God and not for ourselves; it is His work; He is the subject; and we must open ourselves to Him" (Pope Benedict XVI, 3 October 2012).

PANIS VITAE—THE BREAD OF LIFE



We have so far looked at what the Sacred Liturgy is and what the Eucharist is. Beginning this Sunday, the Church takes a brief pause from reading Saint Mark's Gospel to spend four Sundays with the sixth chapter of Saint John's Gospel on the *Panis Vitae*—the Bread of Life.

"Jesus then took the loaves, and when he had given thanks, he distributed them to those who were seated; so also the fish, as much as they wanted" (*John* 6:11; RSV-CE).

Saint John's account of the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves begins with almost the very same words as those which the Synoptic Gospels (*Matthew*, *Mark*, and *Luke*) and Saint Paul use to describe the institution of the Eucharist:

"Now as they were eating, Jesus took bread, and blessed, and broke it, and gave it to the disciples and said, 'Take, eat; this is my body'" (*Matthew* 26:26; RSV-CE).


"And as they were eating, he took bread, and blessed, and broke it, and gave it to them, and said, 'Take; this is my body'" (*Mark* 14:22; RSV-CE).

"And he took bread, and when he had given thanks he broke it and gave it to them, saying, 'This is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me'" (*Luke* 22:19; RSV-CE).

"In the same way also the cup, after supper, saying, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me'" (*1 Corinthians* 11:25; RSV-CE).

This indicates that the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves, in addition to being an expression of the mercy of Christ towards the poor, is a symbol of the Most Blessed Sacrament of the Eucharist, about which He will speak about later (cf. *John* 6:26-58). "The miracles of the multiplication of the loaves, when the Lord says the blessing, breaks and distributes the loaves through his disciples to feed the multitude, prefigure the superabundance of this unique bread of his Eucharist" (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, n. 1335).
