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Multiplication Table Reward Chart – Group Contingency

Materials:

- A blank multiplication table on poster board hanging on wall
 - The answers (numbers) to multiplication table on small pieces of paper or written on tokens in a jar
 - A list of reward students are working towards earning.
- 1) Set up mystery reward. Write rewards on piece of paper. Have a student draw the reward from a hat, but don't let them see reward. Place reward in envelope. Tape envelope next to multiplication chart. Tell students they will earn the reward once they complete a row, column or diagonal on the multiplication chart.
 - 2) Set 1-3 clear expectations for students to follow for example:
 - a. Raise your hand to speak
 - b. Stay in your seat.
 - c. Look at the person who is speaking
 - d. Speak kindly to one another
 - e. Keep your hands, feet and object to yourself.
 - 3) Explain to students that a timer will sound many times throughout the period. If the whole class is following the expectation they will earn a number out of the jar. One student will be called onto pick a number and place it strategically on the multiplication chart. Once a row, column or diagonal is completed they will earn the mystery reward.
 - 4) Set a time to go off on a variable schedule throughout the period. Have it go off frequently when you first start, for example a variable schedule of 3 minutes, then increase the duration of the time intervals as student earn success.
 - 5) When timer sounds quickly scan the class. If all students are following expectations, have one student come up and pick a token from the jar. That student tells the class the number and decides where to place it on the multiplication chart. He/she may take suggestions from classmates. Student tapes number to spot on multiplication chart.
 - 6) Once students complete a row, column or diagonal the teacher opens the envelope (or calls on student to do so) and tells the class the reward.
 - 7) Try to give the reward as soon as you can.

Variations: Continents or country chart, square root chart, 100 chart, dolch word chart, Commonly misspelled words chart, Periodic table.
