Plot Mountain

A story's plot is made up of five parts: exposition, rising action, climax, falling action and conclusion.
After you've finished reading *The Lion, The Witch and the Wardrobe*, fill in the spaces below.

3. Climax

The most exciting and emotional part of the story.

The Witch kills Aslan, who has sacrificed his life so that Edmund can live. Aslan is resurrected and destroys the Witch. Aslan's army wins the battle.

2. Rising Action

The things that happen to push the story forward as we head toward the climax.

Lucy wanders into a wardrobe and into Narnia. Edmund follows Lucy and enters and offers to help the Queen/Witch. Then the four siblings enter Narnia together. Edmund deserts the others and goes to the Queen's castle. Aslan debates with the Queen over Edmund's life.

4. Falling Action

The events that happened during the climax are dealt with.

Aslan frees all the statues by breathing on them and bringing them back to life. Peter, Susan, Edmund and Lucy are crowned as kings and queens of Narnia

1. Exposition

We learn background information about the story's characters, setting, and basic plot.

Siblings Peter, Susan, Edmund, and Lucy are sent away from London during the air-raids at the height of World War II and go to stay with the Professor.

5. Conclusion

The story comes to an end.

Many years later in Narnian time, they find their way back through the wardrobe, where no time has passed in England at all!
